

**HUMMINGBIRDS ARE ATTRACTED TO TUBULAR SHAPED FLOWERS IN RED/ PINK/ORANGE COLOR RANGES. CLOSELY PLANTED FLOWERS OF THE SAME SPECIES OFFER LARGE QUANTITIES OF NECTAR AND ARE EASILY VISIBLE TO THE BIRDS.**

WILL THE PLANTS OFFER PERCHING/RESTING/NESTLING CHOICES? PLANTS THAT ATTRACT SMALL INSECTS ARE ALSO IMPORTANT TO HUMMINGBIRDS FOR DAILY PROTEIN**
